May 8, 2017 Regular Session of the Beaverhead County Commissioners

The Board of Commissioners, in and for Beaverhead County, Montana, met in session on Monday, May 8, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Room of the Beaverhead County Courthouse. Present: Chairman Tom Rice, Commissioner Mike McGinley, Commissioner John Jackson and Secretary Cindy Decker.

Updates on County Projects:

Road Supervisor Scott Jones and Road Secretary Jamie Flynn joined the meeting. The crew has been blading roads where possible. The moisture has been an issue.

Mike asked Jamie to check in her records when the Pioneer Scenic Byway usually opens and if it is mandated to open by May 15 every year. If it's not, the county won't be plowing the snow off the road unless we receive the SRS money.

There was discussion regarding posting some signs stating that the road is closed. When people call, it will be explained that without the SRS money, the road budget will not allow for extra things like plowing the snow off the Scenic Byway.

The crew fixed a spot on the Blacktail pavement last week that was really bad. They dug it out and put millings in it for the time being. Tomorrow the crew will fix a bad hole on Webster Lane.

Scott advised that they will fire up the patching truck this week.

He also advised the commissioners that he has spoken with the DOT regarding keeping log books in the county trucks as Amelia from MACo has requested. The DOT told Scott that they do *not* have to keep a log on a daily basis, but if they drive to Missoula or Billings, for instance, that they should keep a log then. The Road Department will obtain an oversize year long trip permit for all their trucks every year, and if they travel more than 100 miles, they will keep a log.

MOTION: Commissioner McGinley moved and Commissioner Jackson


seconded that the DUI Task Force Annual Report and Budget for July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017 be approved. A verbal vote


was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Public Hearing May 8, 2017 - CDBG

Erinn Zindt from Midwest Assistance Program, DES Coordinator Tom Wagenknecht and Beaverhead County Planner Rob Macioroski joined the meeting.

Commissioner Rice opened the hearing by way of introductions and handed the hearing over to Planner Rob Macioroski.

Rob stated that CDBG has dispersed approximately 5 to 5.5 million dollars every year to the state of Montana for community development projects. So this year, we are in the process of applying for a grant for the Jackson Sewer District. Beaverhead County has had a Growth Policy in place since 2005. It has been updated is a guide to the future growth and development of Beaverhead County along with the Community Economic

Development Strategy which identified Jackson Sewer as one of the priorities to get done. Both the Growth Policy and the Community Economic Development Strategy are available on the county website. Every year the county works closely with Headwaters RC&D to obtain grants to retain current businesses or recruit and assist new businesses coming in. We have also tried to develop some tourism and work closely with the agricultural community. Rob stated that they have identified Jackson Sewer District as one of the priority projects to be done this year.

Erinn introduced herself and stated the requirements for a CDBG Public Hearing so that the county can learn of any potential projects that may be moving forward with a CDBG application. The intent of this first public hearing is to make sure that the commissioners hear from all of the community on projects that would be ready to go for that grant process.

CDBG applications have to go through the county (sponsored).

Erin is with the Midwest Assistance Program and they provide technical assistance to rural and low income communities for anything to help with their water and waste water needs. She has been working with the Jackson Water and Sewer District to see how they can find funding to address some issues.

There have been arsenic problems for years in Jackson that have caused health concerns and also caused them to be out of compliance as well. They have been working with an engineer to find money to be able to pay for a remedy. Part of funding these kinds of projects is using multiple funding sources and she is really hoping to able to move forward with this CDBG application. In addition, they have been number 2 on the priority list for Treasure State Endowment. This project will need more than one grant to complete.

Erinn presented the commissioners with a letter from the Jackson Sewer District explaining their story and requesting to be sponsored by the county for a CDBG application.

Rob advised that the 2nd Public Hearing will be held in Jackson at the fire hall on May 24, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. and will be publically noticed in the Tribune twice.

Mike Strang from Lima attended this hearing to learn more about CDBG and asked some questions regarding some water issues in Lima as well. It was determined that the issue he presented does not fall under the requirements for a CDBG application.

Commissioner McGinley asked about admin costs and if that is included in this grant. Erinn will check into that.

The only project that was proposed today was the Jackson Water/Sewer Project.

This hearing is adjourned at 4:00 p.m.

Unfinished Business/Other Topics of Discussion:

The Commissioners opened their mail and email and responded accordingly.

The Commissioners worked on their individual County projects.
