The Board of Commissioners, in and for Beaverhead County, Montana, met in session on April 14, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners Room of the Beaverhead County Courthouse. Present: Commissioner John Jackson, Commissioner Tom Rice and Commissioner Support Specialist Dana Basile.

Pledge of Allegiance

At this time, those present recited the Pledge of Allegiance aloud to begin the day.

Updates on County Projects

Road Supervisor Bob Ferris was present and reported that they got the Nissen Lane bridge done and open. He mentioned needing to set up time to go see Axes Canyon. Coty and Sky are able to this week so with the time limit, they need to schedule. He is waiting on the culvert to show up that Beaverhead Lane Subdivision ordered. Kodie Bernard is working on getting South Valley Lane open, as the Idaho side is trying to open as well.

Nick commented that there is not much new with the landfill. He is waiting on parts for the kiosk. Last week he got the scale recertified.

Jack added that today is the Master Gardener class. Wednesday he has a workshop at the 4H building and he will be flying the drone for this. Thursday he is going to be up Birch Creek to check out the Bender Center for the 4H trip out there coming up.

Justin mentioned it is a slow week for the Fairgrounds. They are just finishing getting ready to open up. Road Dept will be blading this week too.

Mike commented most of the schools are on spring break this week. He is going to Wise River to swear in a trustee tonight. Only Reichle school will have an election for the Rural Schools. May 9th he is at BCHS to swear in school board members. He will be at the Career Fair at Keltz Arena on Thursday looking to hire a new teacher for Wisdom.

lan mentioned the jail is at 22 with multiple Madison County holds. This week Tuesday and Wednesday he has the biannual detention commander meeting at UMW.

Ceth added it was a busy weekend with a few call outs.

Tracy commented he will be in Helena later this week.

Tom added sanitation has been normal with permits and enforcement issues. Last week he and Joyce were in Helena for a conference. DES turned in the two homeland security grants, the city turned in theirs.

Stacey mentioned this Thursday is the candidate filing opening for Lima and Dillon and the Tech levy for the high school, and middle/elementary school.

Joyce commented they were up in Helena last week and attended lots of very informative sessions. Friday she was in Lima inspecting the hotel, the new owners are already doing renovations.

Shonna mentioned the concrete pad was laid for Public Health and the generator put in place. It will be wired in with the sign in a few weeks.

Amber added this week she is a guest on a podcast and she has Spring training Wednesday and Thursday in Butte.

Rob added he is reviewing 2 surveys this week- one is a family transfer. He had a meeting with the flood plain violator and DNRC last week and they decided DNRC is coming down in person to investigate. He got an inquiry from MDT about the bridge on 90 for a flood plain permit. He and Tom got an email from the engineer representing the church on Lovers Leap and proposing a new access road. Rochelle is out for 12 weeks.

Sky added he looked into the Lovers Leap train issue and there is a \$100 fine for blocking the roadway for longer than 15 minutes.

Randi added that Bo is heading to a conference in Missoula through Thursday. She is out next week for a conference in Butte. She is leading one of those training sessions.
