July 14, 2025 Regular Session of the Beaverhead County Commissioners

The Board of Commissioners, in and for Beaverhead County, Montana, met in session on July 14, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners Room of the Beaverhead County Courthouse. Present Commissioner John Jackson, Commissioner Tom Rice, and Commissioner Support Specialist Dana Basile.

Pledge of Allegiance

At this time, those present recited the Pledge of Allegiance aloud to begin the day.

Updates on County Projects

Road Supervisor Bob Ferris was present and reported the following. They're doing more chloride and blading around the county. They are starting some patch work this week. They looked at Browne's bridge for upcoming inspection. They put up the speed limit signs for the Bannack days speed ordinance.

Jack added he had a great week at the 4H conference. Beaverhead is sending 5 kids to nationals. He will be heading to centennial today for a hay inspection. The extension office intern leaves this week.

Becky added she is still working on budget and paying bills.

Shonna commented that this week Sean is out, Kevin will be out later in the week and next week. She is meeting with carpet company to install in CA office expansion.

Joyce added BOH meeting Friday in Lima was informative. She's running all over county for inspections.

Mike mentioned it is quiet. He has a meeting in Wise River Wednesday night about tuition.

Tina commented that she is still in transition. Cody has been helping a lot. There will be one small subdivision coming up next month.

Stacey added she is working on elections and the transition with Tina moving out of the office.

Tracy commented that he's working on CWPP and landfill scale. He feels there should be some kind of a public notice when the scale goes live.

MOTION: Commissioner Rice moved and Commissioner Jackson seconded that the above named be approved for the MHLAC and BOH. A verbal vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and Action- Speed Zone in Big Sheep Creek

The Commissioners have received a few calls from a landowner on Big Sheep Creek claiming people are driving 60mph down the road. Sheriff Wendt went out to investigate and did not witness vehicles driving excess. He stated dust is a big concern for property owners with the traffic but the trucks seem to drive the suggested speed.

Tom Rice said the sign currently says "suggested speed 35mph" from the creek bottom. He moves to table this topic to look into it further and see if there are other concerns regarding the speed in this area.

MOTION: Commissioner Rice moved and Commissioner Jackson seconded to appoint Tina Caron as the Flood Plain Administrator and Tom Wagenknecht as the secondary administrator. A verbal vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and Action- Appoint Public Administrator

After brief discussion, Commissioner Rice nominated Mike English.

unanimously.

The payroll administrator mentioned the county paid the health insurance for the previous Public Administrator so we need to discuss if that will continue for the new appointment. The Commissioners and Payroll Administrator will look into this further and a letter will be drafted to send to Mike English.
